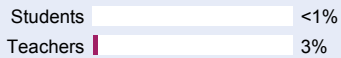

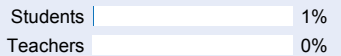

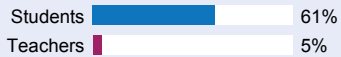

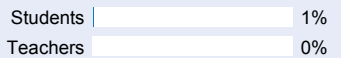

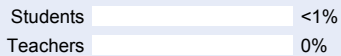

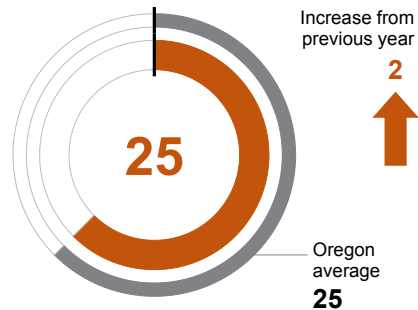

School Environment

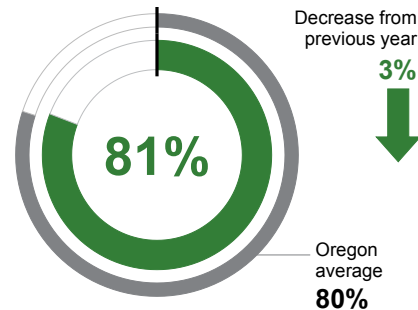
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

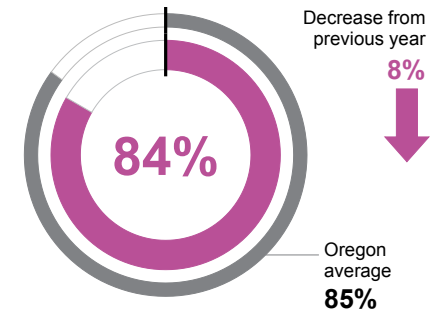
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

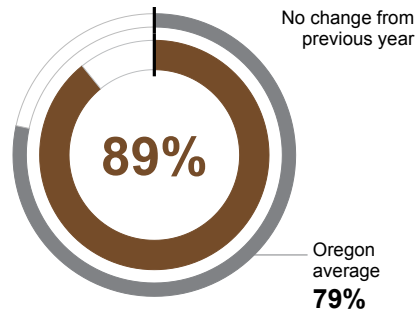
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.



Academic Success

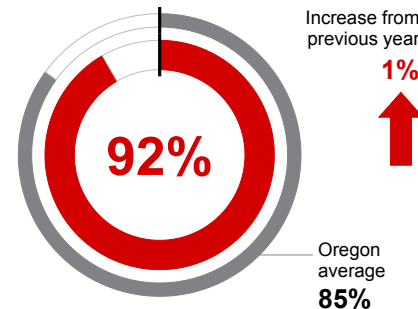
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2014-15.



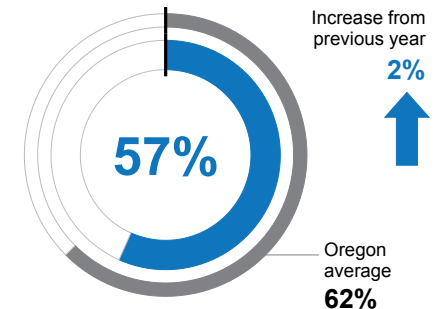
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Students can only learn and earn credits if they are at school. OHS implemented the A2A Attendance System in conjunction with the Strive for Five attendance program, in addition to automated phone calls home every period a student is absent. As a result, our attendance numbers have increased.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

OHS implements systems to increase campus security for students, to include limiting door access and a stronger building visitor protocol. We make serving anyone who enters the office the immediate priority and serving them to the best of our ability. We have interpreters available through staff and a language line. As a result, we have been able to serve anyone who comes through our doors efficiently and effectively.

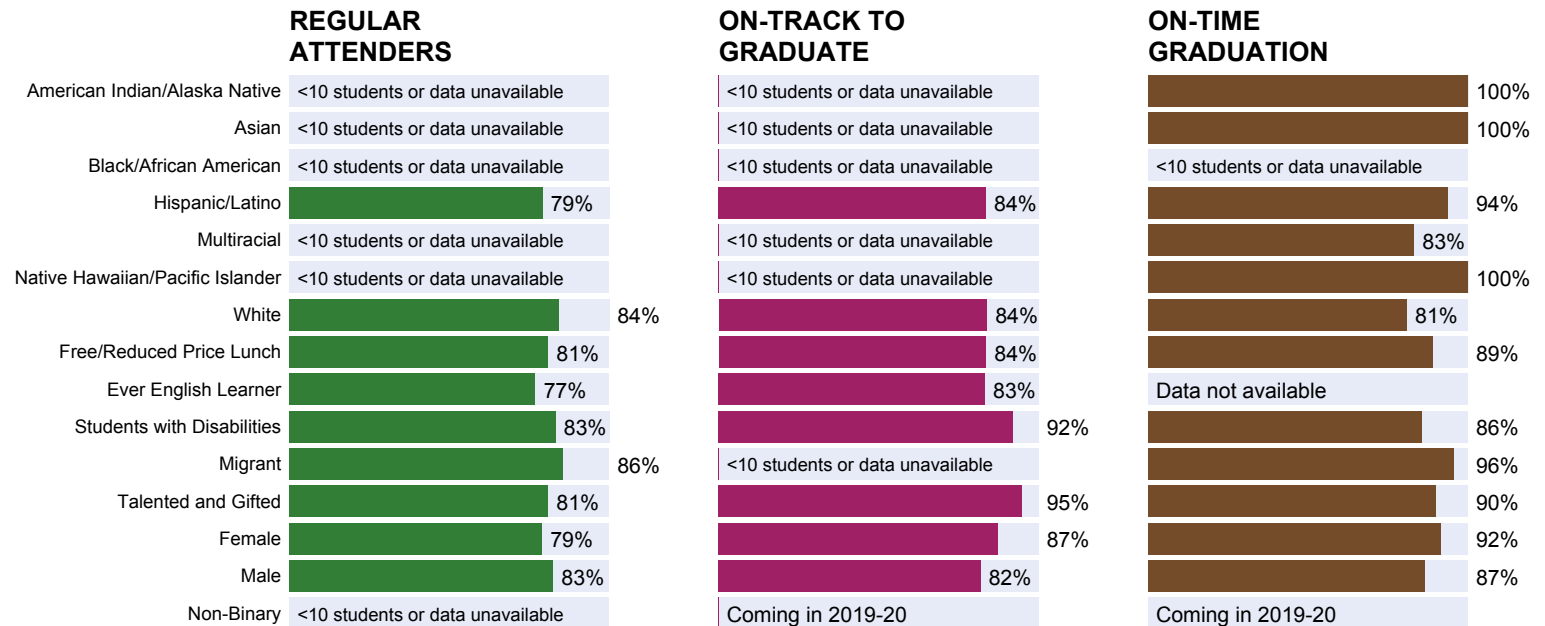

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

OHS offers 2+2 CTE classes that provide free college credits and certifications upon completion in Agriculture, Nursing and Business. We partner with TVCC for dual enrollment courses at a reduced fee. We offer a full Honors course selection, in addition to many college credit option classes in our schedule. We also challenge our TAG students with different enrichment opportunities. Every year we have students who graduate with the majority or all of their Associates Degree completed, giving them a head start financially, as well as in time spent in post-secondary education.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

OHS offers CTE classes in the areas of Welding, Nursing, and Business. These courses have college credit and industry-relevant certifications available to students upon completion. Students at OHS have graduated with certifications that allow them to be instantly employable and give them preference in the job market.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

OHS offers football, cross country, volleyball, soccer, basketball, wrestling, golf, track, baseball and softball. We also offer various clubs to include National Honor Society, Future Business Leaders of America, Future Farmers of America, Future Hispanic Leaders of America, Drama Club, and Fellowship of Christian Athletes. These offerings are almost always free of charge, allowing our students to participate and benefit without barriers.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

OHS has a Parent Involvement Coordinator on staff who organizes informational meetings for parents and students regarding college and financial aid. We organize several informational and feedback meetings related to specific topics, such as safety, for all interested parents and community members. We send out a newsletter four times a year and actively use Facebook to share information. Parents have seen an improvement in the communication between school and home, creating a stronger support system for students.
